

# 1. MALE UROGENITAL SINUS - terminology

## **DIVISIONS OF MALE UROGENITAL SINUS:**

*Urorectal septum* divides cloaca into anorectum and primitive urogenital sinus (UGS).

Upper border of the sinus tubercle (Müllerian eminence) divides the primitive urogenital sinus into *vesicourethral canal* and *definitive urogenital sinus*.

### **Primitive urogenital sinus:**

- a) *Vesicourethral canal*
- b) *Definitive urogenital sinus (vestibule/urethra)*

### **Vesicourethral canal:**

- a) *Upper part:* allantoic diverticulum (urachus)
- b) *Middle part:* urinary bladder, prostatic urethra.
- c) *Lower part:* bladder neck, prostatic urethra.

### **Vestibule/urethra:**

- a) *Pelvic part:* membranous urethra (endoderm)
- b) *Perineal part:* bulbar urethra (endoderm)
- c) *Phallic part:* penile urethra, fossa navicularis / 'glanular' urethra (endoderm),
- d) *Outlet:* inner surfaces of labia and dorsal commissure of labia of the glans penis (ectoderm)

#### **Note:**

*Labia of the glans penis* develop from the **unfused distal end of the vestibular/urethral folds**, and dorsal commissure of the labia of the glans (ectoderm).
